SUBJECT: Consideration of Resolution 2024-97, Adopting the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) as required by the Federal Disaster Mitigation and Cost Reduction Act of 2000

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Resolution 2024-97.

BACKGROUND:

On October, 30 2020, President Clinton signed H.R. 707, the Disaster Mitigation and Cost Reduction Act of 2020, into law. The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2020 requires all jurisdictions to be covered by a Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) to be eligible for Federal Emergency Management Agency post-disaster funds. The City of Banning Police Department worked with the County of Riverside Emergency Management Department (EMD) to develop the LHMP for the City of Banning.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Banning Police Department has worked with the County of Riverside Emergency Management Department to develop the 2023 City of Banning Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP). The 2023 City of Banning LHMP has been through a rigorous review process prior to being brought to the Banning City Council for adoption. It was reviewed and approved by County and State officials, and then received approval from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

FISCAL IMPACT:

No cost associated with the adoption of the LHMP. Approval of Resolution 2024-XX and adoption of the 2023 City of Banning LHMP allows the City of Banning to become eligible for Federal Emergency Management Agency post-disaster funds.

ALTERNATIVES:

Elect not to approve Resolution 2024-97 and provide staff with alternative direction.
