Proposed Resolution No. R26-121- A Resolution of the City of Boynton Beach, Florida, amending Resolution No. 26-109 to Correct the Rolled-Back Millage Rate for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 from 7.4170 to 7.4257, and Providing an Effective Date.

Requested Action: Staff recommends approval of Proposed Resolution No. R26-121.

Explanation of Request:

On June 30, 2026, the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 26-109, setting a proposed millage rate of 7.7500 for the General Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 and stating a rolled-back rate, as required by section 200.065(2)(b), Florida Statutes. Subsequent to adoption, City staff identified a calculation error affecting the rolled-back rate stated in Resolution No. 26-109, as well as the budget deficit figure presented in connection with that resolution. Upon recalculation, the correct rolled-back rate is 7.4257, rather than 7.4170 as originally stated, and the correct budget deficit is \$2,730,198. The deficit figure is provided here for the Commission's information and for consistency with the budget materials previously presented.

The proposed resolution amends Resolution No. 26-109 to correct the rolled-back rate. The proposed millage rate of 7.7500 and the date, time, and place of the first public hearing set by Resolution No. 26-109 are not affected and remain unchanged.

How will this affect city programs or services? This item corrects a calculation error in the rolled-back millage rate and budget deficit figure previously presented to the Commission. It does not change the proposed millage rate of 7.7500, alter the tentative budget, or affect the date, time, or place of the scheduled public hearing. Accordingly, this item has no effect on City programs or services. The correction ensures the City's TRIM compliance filings and budget materials accurately reflect the figures required under section 200.065(2)(b), Florida Statutes.

Fiscal Impact: The proposed Ad Valorem taxes anticipated would be \$82,357,218 while maintaining the current 7.7500 mills.
