Proposed Resolution No. R26-141- Approving the Purchase of Two Emergency Bypass Pumps from Thompson Pump & Manufacturing Co., Inc., Pursuant to the Piggyback Exemption Under the City of Boynton Beach Purchasing Policy Manual, Section IX(8), Piggybacking Florida Sheriffs Association Not-for-Profit Purchasing Cooperative Contract No. FSA23-EQU21.1 (Item #317), Issue a Purchase Order to Thompson Pump & Manufacturing Co., Inc., Authorizing Emergency Bypass Pumps for Master Pump Station 801 and Pump Station 316 for the Utilities Department through Fleet, in a Total Amount Not to Exceed \$150,000.00.

Requested Action: Staff recommends approval of Proposed Resolution No. R26-141.

Explanation of Request: Fleet Management approved the specifications for two emergency bypass pump units for Master Pump Stations #801 and #316 on July 6, 2026 (Reference Nos. ECR-AC-066-2026 and ECR-AC-068-2026). Each unit is a Thompson Pump Model 6JSCE-DJDS-45T-ZC, a 6" sound-attenuated diesel bypass pump, priced at \$75,000.00 through the Florida Sheriffs Association Cooperative Purchasing Contract FSA23-EQU21.1, Item #317, for a total of \$150,000.00.

Purchasing these pumps improves the reliability of critical pumping stations by providing backup capacity during power outages or equipment failures, helping maintain uninterrupted sewer service.

The purchase is made pursuant to the City of Boynton Beach Purchasing Policy Manual, Section IX — Alternatives to Formal Sealed Bids, Item 8, Piggy-backing, riding the Florida Sheriffs Association Cooperative Purchasing Program Contract No. FSA23-EQU21.1 (Equipment), Item #317, under which Thompson Pump & Manufacturing Co., Inc. is the competitively bid primary awardee in all four Florida zones. The contract's Term #3 extension is effective October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026. Procurement Services verified every line of both quotes against the published FSA pricing schedule: all options are at the published contract prices, the RPM throttle actuator is provided at no charge, and each pump carries an additional \$255 multiple-pump discount, bringing each unit to \$75,000.00.

The quotes are valid through September 30, 2026, and delivery is approximately eighteen weeks after purchase order issuance. Procurement Services has completed a piggyback compliance review under the Purchasing Policy Manual, Section IX(8), and recommends approval.

How will this affect city programs or services? The acquisition of these two bypass pumps will directly enhance the reliability and resiliency of the City's wastewater pumping stations. By providing backup pumping capacity during power outages or equipment failures, these units will help ensure uninterrupted sewer service and prevent sanitary sewer overflows that could otherwise disrupt operations, create environmental risks, or affect public health. This investment supports the Utilities Department's ongoing commitment to maintaining consistent, high-quality service delivery to residents and businesses served by the City's wastewater collection system.
