STRATEGIC PLAN:

1.2 Community Engagement: Broaden and deepen engagement of the community in city government, innovating methods for inviting input from the community and stakeholders.

BACKGROUND:

The neighborhood just east of the Gallatin High School are requesting the implementation of a Parking Management District. In 2024 the neighborhood requested the implementation of a Residential Parking Permit District. The direction from the board at the time was to try and create more parking supply, gain compliance for safety related violations, and look at through traffic within the neighborhood. The neighborhood has still shown an interest in a parking district but has shifted to the creation of a Parking Benefit Zone.

The fiscal effects of an Parking Management District or Parking Benefit Zone are shown in the presentation.
