of the South Bozeman Technology District tax increment.

STRATEGIC PLAN: 2.2 Infrastructure Investments: Strategically invest in infrastructure as a

mechanism to encourage economic development.

BACKGROUND: As the City's involvement in tax increment financing (TIF) projects grows

more financially complex, the City has retained Baker Tilly Municipal Advisors

for specialized financial advice. Baker Tilly has deep experience in recommending and right-sizing public development incentives for TIF projects. Baker Tilly was competitively selected for a term contract to provide these services on an ongoing and project by project basis for five

years.

On June 14, 2022, the Bozeman City Commission adopted Resolution 5420

approving projects in the South Bozeman Technology Tax Increment Financing District as Technology Infrastructure Development Projects and

Using Tax Increment Revenues or Tax Increment Revenue Bonds to

Reimburse Eligible Costs of Such Projects. The Resolution approved the use of tax increment revenues or proceeds of tax increment revenue bonds to pay or reimburse Big Sky ICINF, LLC as the developer of the Aurora Project and the INDUSTRY Project (renamed Engine Works in 2024). As both Projects have been completed and are paying taxes, the City needs to move forward in assessing the District's ability to issue a reimbursement for the eligible

project costs per the executed Development Agreement.

Baker Tilly's proposed scope of work is attached.

UNRESOLVED ISSUES: None.

ALTERNATIVES: As recommended by the City Commission.

FISCAL EFFECTS: Baker Tilly estimated the task order cost at \$4,500-\$6,000 to be invoiced an

an hourly rate. This amount is available in the South Bozeman Technology

District Budget.
