STRATEGIC PLAN: 6.3 Climate Action: Reduce community and municipal Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions, increase the supply of clean and renewable energy; foster related businesses.

BACKGROUND: The City of Bozeman Sustainability Division is a member of ICLEI USA, Local Governments for Sustainability USA, part of a network connecting regional governments committed to climate and sustainability goals. As part of their member support, the organization has offered the ClearPath Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory tool, a best-in-class emissions reporting tool that aids in calculating and categorizing municipal and community greenhouse gas emissions. The City of Bozeman has used the ClearPath tool for tracking and reporting community-scale emissions since 2008.

As part of the recent evolution of the ClearPath tool, ICLEI has partnered with the international climate scenario modeling team at ClimateView to introduce [ClearPath 2.0](#), a platform designed to streamline inventory analysis, emissions modeling, and climate action planning.

Sustainability Program Analyst, Kesslie Carlson-Ham, will present and discuss the use and purpose of ClearPath 2.0 in future climate modeling and community engagement.
