Previous Action

July 6, 2023 (Item 13.L) – The Board of Supervisors approved the ratification of the initial contract agreement with Flock Group, Inc. for the provision of license plate recognition technology and related services for the Carson City Sheriff's Office, authorizing execution of the agreement and associated administrative actions.

Background/Issues & Analysis

The Carson City Sheriff's Office has utilized license plate recognition (LPR) technology as a component of its public safety and investigative operations since the initial agreement with Flock Group, Inc. was ratified by the Board of Supervisors in July 2023. The Flock Safety platform provides a suite of LPR cameras and software, including portable, long-range, and solar-powered units, all equipped with proprietary machine learning capabilities for vehicle identification and real-time alerts. CCSO has implemented internal policies and practices to safeguard privacy concerns, only using LPR information for legitimate criminal justice purposes. The system is designed to enhance law enforcement's ability to detect, investigate, and respond to criminal activity by centralizing actionable evidence and improving operational efficiency.

The renewal agreement under consideration maintains continuity of service and upgrades, ensuring that the Sheriff's Office retains access to the latest Flock Safety hardware and software, including the FlockOS™ integrated public safety platform. The agreement specifies a 24-month term, with annual billing and a defined retention period for captured data, aligning with industry standards for evidence management and privacy. The renewal also supersedes any prior agreements, consolidating all previous

terms and ensuring that any overlapping services or payments are reconciled through pro rata credits, thereby streamlining contract administration and fiscal oversight.

The renewal term is structured to commence on July 1, 2026, and conclude on June 30, 2028, with provisions for automatic renewal unless notice is provided, ensuring uninterrupted service and technological support for the duration of the agreement. The annual amount of \$122,500 paid as of July 2025, will remain the same for the next two years.
