SUGGESTED ACTION: Motion to either approve or deny Resolution 25-57,

Case PLN-SUP-24-0009. If the action is to approve, the following are recommended stipulations for approval:

a. The sidewalk café is permitted no more than 7 tables and 28 chairs.

- b. The approved Resolution, including the approved site plan and conditions shall be on display and accessible on the Property during business hours.
- c. Within 30 days following the approval, the Property Owner shall execute an Indemnification Agreement in a form acceptable to the City.
- d. After the business is closed, all furniture (7 tables and 28 chairs) must be stored in the alleyway located to the south of the building. The tables shall be placed adjacent to the building unit and the alleyway gates shall be secured when the business is closed, as generally shown on the Site Plan attached hereto as Exhibit "B".
- e. Clear pedestrian access on the public sidewalk of no less than 5' shall be maintained at all times in a way that neither seating nor tables affect the ingress/egress of travel, the safety or pedestrian and traffic circulation.
- f. The property/business owner shall obtain all State licenses permitting the sale of alcohol as part of

- the sidewalk café.
- g. Any cleaning solution used to clean the sidewalk café area shall be approved by Bradenton Public Works.
- h. Any future increase in seating for the sidewalk café area shall be approved by City Council.

The applicant has submitted a Special Use Permit application requesting permission to allow a sidewalk cafe with alcoholic beverages at 440 12th Street West.
