**EXPLANATION:** 

The applicant submitted a right-of-way vacation application requesting to vacate a 10-foot-wide alley located between properties located at 102 Manatee Avenue East, 120 Manatee Avenue East, 113 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue Drive East. The proposed vacation is approximately 2,129 sq. ft. or 0.049 acres in size.

The applicant is requesting the vacation in order to prepare the property for a future car wash. As part of the vacation request, Florida Power and Light (FPL) submitted a letter of approval with the stipulation that a 10-foot easement be recorded to protect their existing facilities on site.
