1. Approve contract with Sun Street Center for Men's, Women's Perinatal and Non-Perinatal Residential Treatment and Withdrawal Management in an amount not to exceed \$1,857,150.00 for the term of July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2029; and

**BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:**

Clients sometimes require placement in substance use disorder (SUDS) residential treatment facilities as part of their treatment plan. This non-general fund contract provides local licensed residential substance abuse treatment services for San Benito County pregnant women, women within 60 days of postpartum and women with or without children using a social treatment model. This contract also provides for Residential Withdrawal Management for Women. This contract also provides residential treatment and withdrawal management to Male residents of San Benito County.

Individuals involved in this type of treatment are generally participants of court ordered mandated substance abuse treatment. The residential and other ancillary services provided through this contract are eligible for funding through Child Protective Services (CPS), Probation Dept. AB-109 funding and DMC-ODS reimbursement. This is a Fee for Service contract and reimbursement is dictated by use and

as such the total dollar amount of this contract can range from zero to the maximum dollar amount of the contract.

This provider's services are needed to ensure that there are treatment options and bed availability for the client if other options are at capacity and/or the client and counselor anticipate that the client will respond better to their social treatment model.

The County Superior Court, Probation and CPS staffs often work in coordination with Behavioral Health's Substance Abuse Treatment staff in identifying clients who are appropriate for access to this level of residential care.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Behavioral Health issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) on February 16, 2026, soliciting proposals from qualified agencies to provide comprehensive substance use disorder (SUD) residential treatment services to adult clients. The RFP closed on March 11, 2026. The County received 3 completed proposals. 2 of the proposals were disqualified for not meeting the criteria outlined in the RFP. The remaining proposal proceeded on to the evaluation phase of the procurement process.

An evaluation panel of 3 individuals consisting of 2 county employees outside of the Behavioral Health department and 1 staff member from the Behavioral Health department. The proposal was scored against the evaluation criteria matrix as provided in the RFP. Sun Street Center scored an 86% out of 100%.

The evaluation panel awarded this as the proposal demonstrate qualifications, service capacity, and alignment with county needs and regulatory requirements. The awardee has a proven and longstanding history of delivering residential treatment services across multiple counties, reflecting stability, experience, and the organizational capacity required for high quality service delivery. Their proposed service model is notably comprehensive and demonstrates a strong understanding of clinical, operational, and compliance expectations. The organization also maintains the necessary infrastructure to provide residential services immediately upon contract execution, thereby minimizing start-up delays and ensuring continuity of care,

Additionally, the proposer demonstrated innovation in their approach and outlined strategies to reduce barriers to treatment, increase client engagement, and enhance overall service effectiveness. The proposed rates were determined to be cost effective and feasible for long term sustainability, supporting the responsible use of county resources. Based on these factors, Sun Street Centers was determined to be the most responsive and qualified proposer and is therefore recommended for award of the final contract.
