**BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:**

The Behavioral Health Bridge Housing (BHBH) Program was signed into law in September 2022 under Assembly Bill (AB) 179 to provide \$1.5 billion in funding through June 30, 2027 to several county behavioral health agencies including San Benito County Behavioral Health. The BHBH Grant was awarded to SBCBH on 9/5/23 for \$ 2,260,924 for 4 years starting on June 23, 2023 through June 30, 2027 by Advocates for Human Potential, Inc. (AHP) on behalf of the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). The grant has enabled SBCBH in locating and supporting SBCBH clients with severe mental illness (SMI) and/or substance use disorder (SUD). The funding helped to address the immediate housing and treatment needs of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness with serious

behavioral health concerns through increasing housing options and providing ongoing supports.

The Budget Amendment is needed because SBCBH reviewed and realized that there are additional available funds that need to be utilized prior to the BHBH grant concluding on June 30, 2027. SBCBH requests to modify the use of funds to include an allocation of \$274,463.00 for salaries and benefits to cover costs associated with direct client support and administrative oversight of the grant. SBCBH also needs to increase the overall budget within the BHBH grant by \$11,813.00.
