Background:

The Dunedin Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) is equipped with four (4) deep bed denitrifying filters that were installed in 1991 and have been in service continuously since that time. The Utilities Department rehabilitated the valves and pumps for the filtration system in 2019. Over the last several years, wastewater operations staff have begun noticing the backwashing function of the filters is not evenly dispersed across all areas of the filter, and thus may not be fully cleaned with each filter run.

In order to explore this concern, operations staff retained the services of the original equipment manufacturer (OEM), De Nora, in March 2023 to perform the annual process audit of the filtration system. The results of the process audit included recommendations for the complete rebuild / rehabilitation of the existing filters as soon as possible in order to maintain the quality of the effluent produced by the filters.

This project is included in the Capital Improvement Plan approved by Commission and funded in FY24 as the WWTP Facility 8, Filter Media and Basin Rehabilitation project, with an estimated cost of \$1,650,000, inclusive of construction costs and professional services. As such, staff requested a proposal from Ardurra Group, Inc., one of the City's (GEC) General Engineering Services Consultants to provide design, permitting, and construction management services for the rehabilitation of the filtration system.

Following negotiations regarding the necessary services and fees, Ardurra provided the attached scope and fee proposal, for a lump sum cost of \$168,738 for design, bidding, and construction services.

Staff deems the professional services proposed to be appropriate to complete the work, and the corresponding fee to be fair and reasonable. Therefore, staff hereby recommends the City Commission approve the award and authorization to issue a GEC Task Assignment to Ardurra Group, Inc., for a lump sum fee of \$168,738, as detailed herein.
