SUPPLEMENT: L. Fifth Contract Amendment to the Downtown Looper Freebee.pdf

Background:

This proposed off-peak flex pilot program is designed to be partially fixed and partially on-demand. The difference between this service and the fixed service (past pilot program) would be to allow one of the looper vehicles to deviate from the fixed route to pick up a citizen anywhere inside the prescribed geofenced area. This service would be app customized to assure that any trip begins or ends in the downtown and thereby assuring personal vehicle(s) will not be utilized. The proposed geofenced area (Exhibit B) is proposed to be enclosed by San Christopher to the north, Keene Road to the east, Union Street to the south and Edgewater Drive/Alt 19 to the west.

The 90-day Flex Pilot Program will allow staff and Freebee to compare past and current ridership to better assess vehicle usage.

The defined service area of Downtown Dunedin and surrounding neighborhoods will be geofenced within the "Ride Freebee†mobile app so that consumers are only able to request transportation to/from and around Downtown Dunedin. With the on-demand feature, riders can travel to or from the geofenced area, shown in the red color, however, they need to either start and/or end their trip within the Downtown Freebee route Service Area, as shown in blue color. (Exhibit B).

Riders are still able to request a ride by waving a vehicle down anywhere along the route, through the Ride Freebee mobile app or by calling Freebee's dispatch center for on-demand service.

The hours of operation are the same as the previous period's off-peak hours until the end of the 90-day Flex Pilot Program.

- Thurs 3pm 10pm
- Fri 3pm 12am
- Sat 11am 12am
- Sun 11am 7pm

The Flex Pilot Program will start September 23, 2024 and conclude on December 22, 2024 at a cost not to exceed \$48,387. This is a 90-day (3 month) off-peak season pilot program.

The 5th Contract Amendment is consistent with the City of Dunedin Comprehensive Plan:

- Policy 1.2.13.: The City will examine the benefits and potential impacts of ride service vendors, including micro-mobility devices, ride share services, and bike share services, to ensure that the anticipated impacts are properly addressed and mitigated as well as providing appropriate infrastructure /facilities for such services.

The 5th Contract Amendment is consistent with the City of Dunedin Multimodal Transportation Plan:

- Action 1.02: Promote First Mile / Last Mile strategies to fill gaps to transit stops, schools, parks, and connect to off-site parking locations.
- Action 1.09: Implement a downtown curb lane management plan (include loading / unloading, ride share pickup / drop-off, dining, potential micromobility locations).
- Action 4.09: Explore additional micromobility options such as a looper, downtowner, etc to connect to downtown, Mease Dunedin Hospital and TD Ballpark.

On July 7, 2024, Jennifer Bramley, City Manager; George Kinney, Community Development Director and Kathy Gademer, Project Manager met with Bob and Tiffany Potter, owners of Local Tiki Rides. It was determined that the data brought forth by the Local Tiki Rides does not compete with the Freebee Loop, but complements its service. (Exhibits K. and L.).

- Overall, Local Tiki Rides has been in business for five (5) years and is a tip-based business with three (3) sets of drivers. They operate Friday evenings and Saturdays. Reservations by phone call are required. Trips can be anywhere in the County seven (7) days a week, although the weekends are reserved mainly for Dunedin riders. Their ridership is mostly tourists and regulars.
- Overall, Freebee has been in business since 2012 and is government and/or grant funded. Trips are free. They operate Thursdays through Sundays. Riders can wave down, use the app or call to request service. Peak season rides are located on the predetermined route within the downtown core.
