Background:

The City received bids on July 5, 2022, for construction of the two proposed, at-grade and illuminated crosswalks on Douglas Avenue between Monroe Street and Skinner Blvd. The bids ranged from \$273,000 to \$350,885.

Due to funding constraints attributable primarily to the current economic climate in the construction industry, staff recommends deferring the south crosswalk and reconstructing the north crosswalk using City forces. The north crosswalk would be completed as designed with decorative patterned pavement including the installation of an in-road lighting system activated by pedestrian pushbuttons. Further, the crossing would be made ADA compliant. The in-road lighting would serve as a demonstration project to measure their perceived effectiveness in improving pedestrian safety, community acceptance of the lighting system and the product's overall durability.

A modest budget amendment will be necessary to accomplish this work as recommended. City forces are poised to complete the improvements upon Commission authorization. It is estimated to cost \$75,000 to do the north crosswalk with City forces which includes \$40,000 for the in-road lighting system. The project will be coordinated with the local business community and will take into consideration the upcoming Special Events calendar this fall.

Staff recommends construction of the north Douglas Avenue crosswalk utilizing an in-road, pedestrian activated lighting system.
