AGENDA LANGUAGE:	Approve an amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the Glynn County Board of Commissioners and the Jekyll Island Authority and authorize an advance of additional SPLOST 2022 collections in the amount of \$434,374.13 to fund the grant match for the construction of the Jekyll Island Authority's Bike Path Improvements and Rehabilitation project. (R. Talbert)
BACKGROUND:	The SPLOST 2022 referendum included funding for the Jekyll island Authority's Bike Path Improvements and Rehabilitation project. One such project is GDOT Project 0016635 - Shoulder Widening on SR520, beginning at Jekyll Island Guest Information to SR 25. This project completes a safe, six-foot-wide bike path connection from the base of the Sidney Lanier Bridge to Jekyll Island, directly addressing a transportation gap identified in the draft of the Glynn County Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Trails Plan (Pages 6, 23 & 78). The original estimate for the project was \$2.23M, resulting in a GDOT-required match of \$446,000, which has been allocated for payment by the Jekyll Island Authority. GDOT Engineering Services' estimate came in at \$4,524,048.82 for the same project, confirming the low bidder, Reeves Construction Company, was a responsive low bidder at \$3,827,713.58. Due to the increase in the cost vs the original estimate, the GDOT-billed match for the project is now \$880,374.13, leaving the Jekyll Island Authority \$434,374.13 short in funding.

Jekyll Island Authority staff is requesting additional SPLOST funding of \$434,374.13 to cover the balance of the GDOT-required match that remains unfunded at this time.

The attached amendment would amend the original SPLOST 2022 distribution amount to the Jekyll Island Authority from \$3,100,000 to \$3,535,000. All other terms in the original agreement would remain the same.
