The Lynnwood Public Facilities District (LPFD) is advancing a Master Plan and Development Agreement to guide the future transformation of the Event Center site into a vibrant, mixed-use district.

BACKGROUND:

The Lynnwood Public Facilities District (LPFD) is undertaking a long-term master planning effort to guide the future redevelopment of the Lynnwood Event Center site. The proposed Master Plan outlines a vision for a vibrant, mixed-use district with housing, retail, hotel, green space, and expanded event center with outdoor event space. To support this Master Plan, the City and the LPFD have drafted a Development Agreement (DA) that establishes a framework for infrastructure improvements, land use, design requirements, and shared responsibilities over time for this unique development opportunity.

FUNDING:

In this agreement, City would take on responsibility for construction of an extension of 194th St and a new 38th Ave to form a Ring Road for circulation, access, and connection to future City Center street grid. The current estimated cost of the proposed Ring Road project is \$18 million. Funding would come from a combination of grants, tax increment financing (TIF), and City capital funds.
