Recommendation:

Adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Rocklin Approving and Authorizing the City Manager to Execute a Cannabis Tax Fund Grant Agreement with the Department of California Highway Patrol and Other Necessary Documentation to Use the Grant Funds.

Background:

The Rocklin Police Department (RPD) has been awarded a \$101,227.38 grant for education and enforcement of driving under the influence from the Department of California Highway Patrol (CHP). The grant award notice and agreement are included as Attachment 2. The primary focus is to preserve human life by preventing DUI activities. RPD will provide education programs and conduct periodic enforcement operations across the community as it relates to the dangers of impaired driving in our community. The goal is to educate the public, focusing on adolescents, on the dangers of driving under the influence, or being a passenger in a vehicle with a driver who is under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol.

This year's grant award will be used to:

1. Purchase and distribute education/outreach materials, like wrist bands, keychains, flashlights, etc., to be given to members of the community as reminders to dissuade drivers from driving under the influence/driving under the influence of drugs (DUI/DUID) or passengers from getting into a vehicle with an impaired driver;
2. Purchase two Drager Drug Test Analyzers;
3. Specialized training for up to four officers to attend a Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) instructor course and/or Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) training curriculum;
4. Personnel costs for officers to present at education/outreach and/or community events; and to conduct saturation patrols and a DUI/DUID checkpoint.

CHP requires the City Council to provide an authorizing resolution prior to accepting the grant funding. A budget amendment of \$101,227.38 is also required to recognize the grant funds in the Fiscal Year 2026/27 Operating Budget to administer the grant, including the purchase of two Drager Drug test 5000 Analyzers for approximately \$20,000.

Staff recommends authorizing the grant and a budget amendment to increase the revenue and expenditure budgets by \$101,228 within the Traffic Safety/Police Department Grant Fund (Fund 244) to implement and administer the grant.

Fiscal Impact:

The total grant award is \$101,227.38, and grant funds will be expended in accordance with the grant requirements. No City matching funds are required.
