#### Recommendation:

Adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Rocklin Approving and Authorizing the City Manager to Execute Subawardee Grant Agreements with the City of Sacramento Accepting the Terms and Subaward of the 2024 Homeland Security Grant Program Urban Areas Security Initiative.

## **Background:**

The Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Program assists high-threat, high-density areas in efforts to build and sustain the capabilities necessary to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. The UASI program is intended to provide financial assistance to address the unique multi-discipline planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs of these areas and to assist in building and sustaining capabilities to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism using the whole community approach.

The City of Sacramento is the regional agency for the Homeland Security Grant Program Urban Areas Security Initiative.

For the Fiscal Year 2024 award, the Department of Homeland Security is focused on the criticality of information sharing and collaboration to building a national culture of preparedness while protecting against terrorism and other threats to national security. The threats to the nation have evolved during the past two decades, which now faces continuous cyber threats by sophisticated actors, threats to soft targets and crowded places, and threats from domestic violent extremists who currently pose the greatest terrorism threat to the nation.

The City of Sacramento, in coordination with the City of Rocklin Police Department for the benefit of the Sacramento Urban Area, applied for and was awarded a grant on September 1, 2024, from the Homeland Security Grant Program-Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) in the amount of two million eight hundred twenty thousand six hundred seventy-two dollars

(\$2,820,672), starting on or about October 1, 2025 and concluding March 30, 2027. The City of Rocklin Police Department has been awarded a subaward from the City of Sacramento in the amount of sixty-three thousand dollars (\$63,000) for the specific purpose to purchase the software offered by Peregrine Technologies, Inc.

The Peregrine Technologies, Inc. software is designed for law enforcement data integration, analysis and information sharing. The platform enables agencies to securely consolidate, search, and analyze records from multiple data sources to support investigations, operations, and public safety initiatives. A detailed description of services and deliverables is included in Attachment 5.

The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) require the Rocklin City Council adopt a Resolution (Attachment 1) in order to execute the agreement and accept and use the Subaward.

Staff recommends the City Council adopt a Resolution approving the grant subaward. As part of the Resolution, staff also recommends the City Council authorize any budgetary and accounting transactions up to \$63,000 in the Fiscal Year 2025/26 Operating Budget in the Police Grant Fund (244) necessary to administer the grant.

## **Fiscal Impact:**

There is no impact to the General Fund. The total grant award is \$63,000 and no City match is required.
