Subject: Appointment to the Town's Public Art Advisory Commission

Recommendation to Council:

Adopt a resolution approving the Mayoral appointment of Zoey Arent to serve on the Public Art Advisory Commission as youth commissioner, pursuant to California Government Code Section 40605, with ratification by Council.

Strategic Plan Element:

The recommended action supports the goal of Organizational Effectiveness. Goal Statement: Achieve a high performing organization by nurturing an engaged workforce committed to a shared vision of public service.

Background:

The Public Art Advisory Commission serves in an advisory capacity to the Town Council and the Parks and Recreation Director, or their designee, to support the Town by establishing Windsor as an art destination that raises the potential for education, innovation, collaborative community engagement and cultural exploration. To be eligible for appointment to the Commission, members shall be residents of Sonoma County, and are preferred to be residents of the Town; Youth Commissioners must have a junior (11th grade) or senior (12th grade) status. Youth seats will be appointed by Council majority vote, will hold a non-voting status with an "input only" capacity, and will serve a one-year term commencing in June. The Public Art Advisory Commission meets the fourth Wednesday of the month at 4:30 p.m., in the Windsor Civic Center Council Chambers, 9291 Old Redwood Highway, Building 400, Windsor, CA.

Discussion:

On August 24, 2023, the Town advertised for two (2) youth seats on the Public Art Advisory Commission. The two (2) youth members are required to hold either a junior (11th grade) or senior (12th grade) status. Youth appointments hold non-voting status with an "input only" capacity and are appointed by Council majority vote.

The recruitments to fill the vacant seats were posted on the library's bulletin board, on the Town's bulletin board, the Chamber of Commerce's bulletin board and the bulletin board next to Safeway. Vacancies were advertised on the Town's electronic sign at the corner of Exchange Bank, Nextdoor and on the Town's Facebook and web pages to encourage Windsor residents to apply. In addition, for the Youth Appointments, the vacancies were advertised at local high schools. Commissioners who held previous seats were invited to re-apply. The deadline for submittal of applications was Monday, September 25, by 6:00 p.m. One application was received by former youth commissioner Zoey Arent.

The advertisement will continue until the second youth commissioner seat is filled.

Fiscal Impact:

Environmental Review:

The recommended action is not subject to review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
